

Letter from Our Executive Director Dear friends of Well House, 2016 was an incredible year for our organization. Most importantly, we moved people off the streets since 2013 – 97 adults and 37 children. Over 90 percent of

2016 was an incredible year for our organization. Most importantly, we moved 134 people off the streets since 2013 – 97 adults and 37 children. Over 90 percent of those folks have not become homeless again. As you likely know, we prioritize applicants who have been denied other housing options.

We are so proud of this work. You helped make it possible. 35 of our tenants have received employment through our farm or on our housing rehabs. These opportunities have increased the income of our tenants, and provided a sense of meaning and purpose.

Well House isn't simply a nonprofit, it is a movement. A movement that believes that the solution to homelessness is housing. A highlight in 2016 was the visit we organized with Dr. Sam Tsemberis, founder of the Housing First Model. Hundreds of community members came to one of several events we planned with our community partners.

We still have so much work to do! We have received 547 applications, which means we have turned away far more people than we have housed due to lack of capacity. We will re-double our efforts in 2017. We can't wait to continue this critical and effective work with you. We can end homelessness in Grand Rapids!

Purchased and Completed New Homes

Purchased 2 new houses for restoration, and also completed work on 2 more homes, bringing our total number of homes owned to 13, with 8 lots for food growing

Life Changing Housing and Employment


Housed an additional 60 people bringing our total # of people housed from 2013-2016 to 134

Employed 35 tenants who earned income working 6,704 hours


